National student loan debt now totals more than \$1.5 trillion, and many borrowers are finding it increasingly difficult to keep current. Student loan debt has historically been very difficult to discharge in bankruptcy. However, there is a new push by courts, commentators and attorneys to revisit the rigid test of undue hardship set forth in *In re Brunner*. Our panel will discuss the Brunner test, how it is being applied by the courts, and what changes might be necessary to ensure that student loan debt does not become a permanent drag on the economy and the lives of student loan borrowers.
